The world will be a better place if everyone works at their highest ethical standards to serve the society and to fulfil the Object of Rotary.

DECLARATION FOR ROTARIAN IN BUSINESS AND PROFESSION

As a Rotarian engaged in a business or profession, I am expected to:

- 1. Consider my vocation to be another opportunity to serve;
- 2. Be faithful to the letter and to the spirit of the ethical codes of my vocation, to the laws of my country, and to the moral standards of my community;
- 3. Do all in my power to dignify my vocation and to promote the highest ethical standards in my chosen vocation;
- 4. Be fair to my employer, employees, associates, competitors, customers, the public and all those with whom I have a business or professional relationship.
- 5. Recognize the honour and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society;
- 6. Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community;
- Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or profession;
- 8. Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

The classification principle helps clubs to achieve a more diverse representation of their communities and maintain a well-balanced membership in which no one business, profession, or type of community service predominates. Rotary Clubs are not recommended to have more than 2 members with the same vocation or more than 5% of her membership. This will not only enable us to get to know more people from different walks of lives, but also to attract members coming from different fields having the leadership characteristics and to apply their expertise in serving their local communities. Therefore service projects such as "Career EXPO" for secondary schools would best showcase our capabilities in demonstrating our strengths.

LIFE PLANNING – ROTARY MOCK INTERVIEW WORKSHOP

In the morning of 14/12/2015, a large group of over 90 Rotarians of Rotary District 3450 were drawn to a program for 200 young students who need a mock interview. At 8:30am sharp all Rotarians arrived at Shau Kei Wan Government School at Chai Wan, HK. It was a windy morning and most of us didn't even have time for breakfast. After an hour briefing, we were paired up and met with four to five students. Since they were young and had no experiences on interviews for job or whatever situation, we asked them to do one session of interview with comments among themselves and later on interviewers gave them comments of what the key weaknesses had been observed. To correct such weaknesses, they were giving instructions and practices. During a short break with breakfast, interviewees were back to assembly hall for debriefing. Immediately followed with another session of interview with same group of students and interviewers. Before departure, all participants were reassembled again for final report and evaluation.



Almost all participants stayed behind and gave thanks to interviewers, taking photos and writing thank you notes to their interview panellists. Never seen such a happy ending in rotary function, by the time we left the venue, it was already 2:30pm. Although missed our lunch time, we all were happy to provide a meaningful gift through mock interview to young students!

The World's Greatest Meal to Help End Polio and The Rotary Flame Jointly Visited Hong Kong

District Leaders and Rotarians warmly welcome PP Susanne Rea, Project Partner & Global Team Coordinator of The World's Greatest Meal to help End Polio (WGM) and The Rotary Flame to Hong Kong on 10-14 January 2016.

Initiated by PDG Mukesh Malhotra (Rotary Club of Hounslow, District 1140, England) and PP Susanne Rea (Rotary Club of Cairns Sunrise, District 9550, Australia), WGM was launched as a joint project to help end polio around food, fun and fundraising.

As of 22 January 2016, 2,264 WGM events have been registered in 71 countries for more than 125,900 participants worldwide. So far, USD \$1,714,285.21 has been raised, a total of USD \$5,142,855.63 with matching funds from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. (From 2013 to 2018, every US\$1 raised is matched by US\$2 from the said Foundation thus tripling our contribution). This translates to enough funds to buy more than 8,571,000 Polio Vaccinations.

WGM Events can be big or small, two people sharing a cup of coffee donating an equal amount to the Polio Fund or whenever a meal event is planned at Club or District, it might be an idea to include a certain amount as contribution towards Polio in the registration, for example. The Rotary Flame <u>https://rotaryflame.wordpress.com/</u> was launched by the Rotary Club of Madras, District 3230 in Chennai, India where it was first lit on December 13, 2014 by Past RI President Gary Huang at Rotary Institute in Chennai, to commemorate India becoming polio-free. Having mutually agreed to join hands, the Rotary Flame has accompanied PP Susanne on a journey of awareness and fundraising for polio eradication.













Headlines:

There are eleven weeks to go until the globally synchronized switch from the trivalent to bivalent oral polio vaccine, an important milestone in achieving a polio-free world. The WHO Executive Board is meeting this week, reviewing the report on polio eradication.

On 21 January, Syria passed two years without a reported case of polio despite the conflict which has affected the delivery of health services, including childhood vaccinations.



Celebrate Rotary's 111th Birthday on 23 February

To date, Rotary has contributed more than \$1.5 billion to fight polio. Through 2018, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation will match two-to-one every dollar Rotary commits to polio eradication (up to \$35 million a year). Celebrate the occasion by making donation to End Polio Now!

Joint Service Project in Mongolia Rotary Club of SoHo Hong Kong & Rotary Club of Tamir

With the opportunity of joining District Governor's Visit to Mongolia in Aug 2015, Rotary Club of SoHo Hong Kong and Rotary Club of Tamir, Mongolia started our friendship.



Thanks to the diligent liaison of Rotarian Dr Enkhzul Jargal and Prof Albert Chan, our clubs decided to hold the first 'Joint Service Project of Mental Health, Suicidal Prevention, Fatigue and Crisis Management Training' to Rotarians, Police Officers, Medical Doctors, Teachers, Social Workers, Power Plant Seniors, and Flight Tower Controller in the period of 8-14 Jan 2015. During the 7 workshops in 5 days, we aimed to reduce suicidal rates and highlighted its awareness among the professional and the general population. 500 participants directly benefited from all these workshops.

This project also had 3 TV, 1 newspaper interviews, and 1 internal Police Department interview. It got media coverages to whole Ulaanbaatar.

Credit should go to Rotary family. RC of Tamir initiated this meaning project and provided logistic while RC of SoHo HK matched up the professional. And most importantly, we believe this project can be followed up and sustained to train the trainer for the public in need.














The 2016 Rotary International Convention will be held 28 May – 1 June in South Korea
