"Rotary Club of Tai Po organized a series health program in Tsing Yi; Rotary Club of Kowloon Golden Mile organized body check for elderly in Mongkok; Rotary Club of New Territories organized health talk in Tuen Mun: Rotary Clubs in Macau and Rotary Club of City Northwest Hong Kong promoted Blood donation in Macau and Hong Kong respectively; Rotary Club of Macau and Rotary Club of Kowloon Tong offered dental checkup and care for elderly and children respectively; Rotary Club of Hong Kong Northwest and Rotary Club of New Territories promoted Organ donation to the public; Rotary Club of Hong Kong South offer free medical consultation to the poor; Rotary Club of Peninsula South organized free surgical treatment to the poor and free blood check up for the poor in Mongkok district; Rotary Club of Peninsula Sunrise offered eye checkup and education to the elderly and free blood tests for Elderly in Mongkok Area; Rotary Club of Peninsula, Rotary Club of Tsim Sha Tsui, Rotary Club of Kingspark Hong Kong, Rotary Club of Golden Bauhinia and Rotary Club of Kowloon Golden Mile provided treatment support, rehabilitation to the disabled and with rare disease; Rotary Club of Hong Kong Island East will organize health talk to the public and Rotary Club of Lion Rock will organize Health Exercise for Disability in Feb 2016.

In Mongolia, Rotary Club of Narlag Ulaanbaatar and Rotary Club of Hong Kong organized the mobile clinic for HPV testing and vaccination in Mongolia; Rotary Club of Niislel and Rotary Club of Peninsula organized the Vocational Training Team in Mongolia to correct the Dysplasia hip deformity. Rotary club of Hong Kong Island West offered free open heart surgery through Gift of Life"

I salute and thank every Rotarian who offers the gift of health to the people in Hong Kong and beyond.





District PR Workshop

District PR Seminar was held successfully on 5 December 2015. It was well attended by 50 Rotarians including Club PR Chair and new members.

Ms Bonnie Chiu, Associate Head for the Department of Journalism at the School of

Communication of Hong Kong Baptist University was our key speaker. Ms Chiu's topic was "What and How: To Make News?". She shared and discussed with us what the new definitions **are** and elements which make news. These elements include viewpoint/subjective, interesting/entertaining/short/simple, strong visual element, sarcastic/parody. She also shared with us how can we get our message out and work with the journalists. Lastly, she shared with us what can be done if we are in the news for the wrong reasons and what to consider for crisis management.



PDG Ada Cheng, District PI Committee Chair, then provided the following overview to the participants:

- Strengthening Rotary's Brand and promoting Rotary's Core Values.
- It is important for us to give out consistent messages and images.
- The type of resources available at International and district level.
- Introduction of the new Visual Identity Guidelines for our Young Leaders, which aligns our visual guidelines to bring our programs for young leaders closer to Rotary.
- Reminding all participants that our District has put together localized visual guide and standardized our District logo and Clubs' logos, boiler plate in introducing Rotary and our District, bio-lingual District Pamphlet.
- Using real examples to demonstrate the correct way to use the Rotary's signature system.
- Suggesting all participants to share what they have learned, live the brand and work to improve member engagement.

The Rotary Foundation recognizes those individuals or couples whose combined personal giving have reached US\$10,000, regardless of the gift designation. Major Donors may elect to receive a crystal recognition piece and pin(s) commemorating the gift at each new recognition level.

Headlines:

Looking back at 2015 and ahead at 2016--a wrap-up of the year shows fewer cases in fewer places than ever before. Nigeria was removed from the list of polio endemic countries, Africa marked an entire year without wild poliovirus for the first time in history and type 2 of wild poliovirus (WPV2) was declared eradicated. In addition, more than 80% of the world's birth cohort will be routinely receiving a dose of the inactivated polio vaccine to boost their immunity against polio by the end of 2015. These achievements provide a springboard for progress in 2016.

There are four months to go until the globally synchronized switch from the trivalent to bivalent oral polio vaccine.

This will be an important milestone in achieving a polio-free world.

WPV1 cases for 2015 is now 51, compared to 290 by this time in 2014.

Rotaract

Rotaract brings together people aged 18-30 in universities and communities worldwide to organize service activities, develop leadership and professional skills, and have fun. Rotary clubs sponsor them, but Rotaract members manage and fund their clubs independently. Rotaract members work closely with their local Rotary club, and may join after their Rotaract membership ends.

Interact

Interact is a club for youth aged 12-18 who want to connect with others in their community or school. Interact club members have fun while carrying out service projects and learning about the world. Interact clubs organize at least two service projects a year: one that benefits their community and one that encourages international understanding. While Interact clubs receive guidance from individual Rotary clubs, they govern and support themselves.

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Rotary Club of Happy Valley Bread Run – Wan Chai to Yau Tong

Rotary Club of Happy Valley fully participated in this project, which was initiated and organized by Feeding Hong Kong. The aim of this project is to promote the idea of treasuring food, by gathering breads that almost expired but still in good conditions to low income families.

The whole project is simple and economic: members of RC Happy Valley signed up through Feeding Hong Kong. Then go to assigned shops (all of them are bakery shops) during their close time. Gather the breads with the help of the shopkeepers, and deliver the breads to Feeding Hong Kong's head office cum store in Yau Tong. At this point, the mission is accomplished.

If you wish to make further contributions, you may even help sorting out the breads that were gathered and place them into different boxes, so that they could be delivered to all the needed people right away.(Note: usually, the breads will be delivered to local schools, from where the children of low income families can take the breads as their breakfast or even lunches.)


