Rotary Action Against SARS Committee

國際扶輪 3450 地區「扶輪抗災行動」四大項目： 「沙士」孤兒獎學金、環境衛生教育、海外宣傳香港、扶青扶少齊向醫護致敬

Dear Club Presidents,

The RAAS Committee met on 7 May 2003 to discuss the various ideas and suggestions, which were gathered from the brainstorming meeting held on Friday 2 May 2003.

In addition to the Government's financial support, it was noted that there were other funding sources from various service organizations and private corporations. These sources were aimed to provide assistance to the frontline medical group and families of the infected patients.

General comments received were that the District should concentrate their efforts in conducting project of a larger scale and leave the smaller tasks to the individual club to handle. It was agreed that the District should carry out long term programme as follows:

1. Rotary scholarship to children of SARS victims

The District would set up two University Scholarships for a total amount of HK\$200,000 for two children of SARS victims. The committee would approach the "We Care for Education Fund" and seek their assistance to deal with all administration matter and to recommend the suitable candidates.

2. Environmental and hygiene education

The District would produce leaflets related to environmental and hygiene education for distribution to primary and secondary schools, and to host seminar and workshop for general public. We will also invite participations and involvements from Rotaractors and Interactors. We will recruit "Doctor"

Rotarian volunteer to assist in running of hygiene education programme and providing medical information.

Budget allocated for this project would be HK\$200,000.

3. Positive message to overseas

It is essential to let Rotary Clubs worldwide know how SARS has affected the Rotary movement in our District and what action we had taken such as the set up of RAAS. Articles to be posted to the Rotary Newsbasket and the Rotarian magazine.

4. Involvement of Rotaract and Interact

In addition to the environmental and hygiene education programme, all Rotaractors and Interactors are invited to write a message to the frontline medical group. The messages would be collected and sent to the hospital together with a letter or brief message from the Club Presidents. All messages would be compiled collectively in a booklet with the title "We salute to our Heroes".

Lastly, with respect to the monetary donation to the students and teachers of the two universities, the District would undertake to make up the balance should there be a shortfall of donation from the target amount of HK\$200,000.

All the above plans are counted on the generous donation from each Rotarian of our District for an amount of HK\$333 each.

We will keep all of you informed about further progress of the committee.

100% Polio Eradication Club in December 2002. The project was publicised in four well-established local papers and in Rotarian publications. Very positive feedbacks have also been received from other Rotary Clubs both within and outside District 3450. Well done and congratulations to all the members of Rotary Club of Bayview Sunshine Hong Kong!

The Rotary Club of Beijing (provisional) made history in March 2003 when it successfully organised the first high-level charity event to raise awareness about HIV/AIDS in the Peoples' Republic of China. The 600 guests who converged on Beijing's five star Kempinski Hotel on 29 March 2003 to attend the black tie gala dinner and ball included a wide array of Chinese and international VIPs, ranging from ministerial-level government officials to movie stars, fashion models, dancers, diplomats, business leaders, performing artists and dignitaries from District 3450. A detailed report on the event was covered in last month's DG letter. Rotary's visibility and image are solidly strengthened in the Peoples' Republic of China, where we only have two provisional clubs, through outstanding media and public relations efforts by the club in Beijing. Rotary was widely mentioned on TVs, newspapers and magazines. The District PR Committee voted unanimously in favour of the RI Public Relations Award to go to Rotary Club of Beijing (provisional).

My Fight, My Words

-From the District Governor Elect

我見我言 - 候任區總監本月見聞

The outbreak of the Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS) has been torturing us and the number of deaths of our citizens has been increasing everyday in the past two months. It is advised by the Government that there should not be any gathering nor meeting with over 8 people. It is also suggested that we should stay home after work, keep away from crowded places, keep personal hygiene up to standard and keep all public spaces clean.

In order to minimize the chance or the risk to get diagnosed this disease, most Rotary Clubs' meetings were cancelled. Special events, annual balls, and fellowship dinner were all postponed until further notice. However, a few clubs were still carrying out the meetings regularly as there are not too many members in the clubs.

Under the current situation, District Assembly has once been postponed to May 18, then to June 14 or 15. I hope by that time, this nightmare will be over and all the people in Hong Kong would come back to their normal lives.

At the end of March, District Governor led a delegation to visit Beijing and Shanghai. President Serge Dumont of RC of Beijing (Provisional) invited the delegation to an Annual Ball fundraising to help China to fight against AIDS. I did not attend the event as my daughter's wedding ceremony was held on the March 30 in Hong Kong.

On March 31, the next day after the wedding, I flew to join the delegation and attended a signing ceremony at the Ministry of Health. This was an Update Signing On Agreement Of Rotary Hep B Project signed by two related parties, i.e. DG Gloria and DGE Jones Wong representing Rotary District 3450, and Vice Mayor Mr. Xin Bao-Shan representing The People's Government of Handan City. Our Rotary Project, Hepatitis B immunization in Handan City of Hebei Province, started right away to commit our promise to help China to immunize one million newborn babies to save them from the Hepatitis B virus within the next 10 years.

The next day, on April 1, we had District Governor's Official Visits to RC of Beijing (Provisional) in the

afternoon and RC of Shanghai (Provisional) in the evening respectively. We had the two city visits within a day because DG Gloria wanted to deliver the Official District Banners to these two clubs in China, signifying that these two clubs are officially included into our District 3450 as from February 7 2003.

Welcome RC of Beijing (Provisional) and RC of Shanghai (Provisional).

During a District Management Committee (DMC) meeting on April 14, PP Tony Choi of RC of Admiralty was invited to introduce the campaign "Operation UNITE" initiated by Mr Bernard Chan, Councilor of Legislative Council of Hong Kong SAR, together with several other renowned individuals as well as the public media, TV and Radio stations. Operation UNITE is a multi-sector, action-oriented campaign to draw the community together to fight against the challenges posed by (SARS). Operation UNITE also is conceived as an Action Campaign to boost solidarity and morale in Hong Kong during this anxious time.

Considering that this is the time that all Rotarians in the District to do something to respond the urgent need in our community. DG Gloria has set up an action committee and designated me to work out on all the details to support the campaign. The name of the committee is "Rotary Action Against SARS" (RAAS).

Without delay, an urgent message was sent out to the District to urge our Rotarians to unite all strengths to fight with SARS. To show our care to the frontline medical workers, to spread the positive message to all overseas and international connections, to clean up our surroundings, and to set new hygiene standards for Hong Kong, we are now asking from each and every Rotarian in the District for a small donation of \$333.00. This amount will go to the funding for the medical equipment in need for the Hospital Authority, or for the usage of any other contingency planning.

This is the time for us to Sow the Seeds of Love and to Lend a Hand to all those in need. Thank you for your support.

During the April 14 District Management Committee Meeting, DG Gloria appointed a task force, under the leadership of DGE Jones Wong, to help the society in fighting against SARS. It was named the "Rotary Action Against SARS Committee" (RAAS). Note 1 The first meeting was held on April 15, at the RIC and a number of initiatives were drawn up. One of which was to broadcast an appreciation message to the healthcare professionals. Because of budget limitations, it was agreed that we advertise it on the Outdoor TV Panels located at the junction of Austin Road and Nathan Road, and the E-Tech Center of the Hennessy Road Note 2, at a nominal rate, and a low-cost production budget. I was appointed to take up this assignment.

"We Salute, We Appreciate, We Respect and We Support" is the key message that we broadcast, starting from May 1, to the public in appreciation of the healthcare professionals' risking of their lives in fighting against SARS. The advertisement Note 3 is broadcasted in both Kowloon and Hong Kong outdoor TV electronic panels for a month, with a minimum of 18 spots each day, at a very special rate. We are in the process of negotiating for more spots per day, and if successful, it could be extended for another month. The total cost would be less than HK\$10,000, including production and creative.

We sincerely hope that the SARS epidemic can be contained as soon as possible.
