Governor's Message

Dear Rotarians,

I wish you all a most satisfying year in your Service to the needy, sustaining physical and mental stamina and happiness from your heart exuding to the others throughout the Year of the Ram!!

Returning from the International Institute taken place at Anaheim in late January, I have in my mind the urgent needs of attention to the areas of concern in the Rotary world—the retention of membership after the growth from past year and the continual effort needed to keep our promise to eradicate Polio.

By now you all have probably learnt of the pilot program to achieve over 80% of membership retention in the next three years. A number of clubs are committed to do it according to the suggested program as a model to follow; however, more involvement in the cross-clubs interaction

among Rotarians in discussion and sharing of experience is certainly a significant way of attaining this goal. Sunday, 16 March is set aside to hold a New Member Orientation Programme for all Rotarians in Hong Kong. The

participation is going to be a statement in itself of how much you want your club to be healthy and strong.

Continual effort should be put into the Polio Eradication to make sure we will reach our target of 80 million US dollars among 31,256 Rotary clubs in the world. RC of Bayview Sunshine has demonstrated that fundraising for an important cause can be fun, healthy and educational for the participants and children. Most of all, the event touched so many more hearts that would want to give and join the eradication team. The club in Shanghai was moved to hold a Ball in May for this purpose. Companies in the community would want to join hands with our District to sell t-shirts and to raise awareness, at no cost to us. All these, exemplify what Rotary Movement is about.

When an action has taken place in service, we do need to mention and publicize.



Some might shy from being not "modest"; however, the emphasis we must not neglect is the positive

influence it can affect the community and move more people to do the like. For this reason, please do not neglect to recognize your clubs' achievements by submitting application for the Significant Achievement Award so that I can nominate to the RI (only one per district) by 4 March, 2003. As for your clubs to have the Presidential Citation for the achievements in the Four Avenues of Service, just send it in to me. It would be a joy to see each Club can be awarded with this Citation (one for each club provided the four avenues of service have been achieved) by 5 April, 2003; and the RI Public Relations Award (one per District) by 5 May, 2003. These are the dates to reach me so that I have enough time to deliberate on them before reaching RI.

Before I sign off, I hope that you have already or thinking of registering at the International Convention at Brisbane, Australia. This is a great chance for us all to have fellowship among ourselves and with Rotarians from all over the world. I am also the Co-Chairman of the Asia-Pacific Breakfast Fellowship on 2 June. This is an honor for our District 3450 and I hope you all will participate to demonstrate our unity and enthusiasm.

My Sight, My Words -From the District Governor Elect

This is my February issue that is going to be another highlight for me in my Rotary career. On the 7th January 2003 I started my first seminar, the Pre-PETS (President-Elect Training Seminar), which was the second time of this kind in our District. With the great help from our District Trainer PDG Y.K., we had the pleasure to have invited R.I. Director-Elect Jocelyn I. "Joc Joc" Bolante as our keynote speaker at the seminar. Incoming District Secretaries Tony Wong and Luci Yau have done a great job to have the venue, catering, and most importantly the participants all prepared very well. With such a bright and cheerful beginning, I have confidence that we shall walk out a successful path in my Rotary year.

On the 26th January 2003, Shirley and I took an early flight to attend the District Governors training—an International Assembly held in Anaheim California. We were quite lucky that our 4 pieces of luggage were not spot checked all the way, although we were told that the US customs would carefully examined all luggage and hand-carried items during this highly secured period.

It was still Sunday morning when we arrived Orange County where Anaheim City is located. We were greeted by some friendly fellow Rotarians and were arranged to take a ride in a comfortable coach together with a few more fellow District Governors-Elect from other countries. By the time we

checked in the Hotel Anaheim Hilton, it was about 11:30a.m.. The first person we met was someone whom I know very well - PDG Y.K., our District Trainer. He was wearing a smart looking red vest as Sergeant-At-Arms in this International Assembly. Then I met PDG Dom Vessigault, who was the Chief Sergeant-At-Arms. I felt very relieved as we have two strong officials representing our small District 3450.

The International Assembly is an annual festival for Rotary. It was attended by very special people, who came from Evanston, the ever faithful and hardworking Secretariat staff; and from all over the world, the dedicated past R.I. Presidents and the serving R.I. Directors and R.I. Trustees of the Foundation and the Training Leaders. All of these Rotary senior leaders made the journey year after year to share their knowledge and experiences.

There were 529 Governors-Elect in total attending at the International Assembly. At least 80 percent of the Governors-Elect came along with their spouses, who also have to take some special training programs during the period. The training period began on 8.45 am on Monday, 27th January after the Opening Plenary Session. The most remarkable moment was the first announcement of the "Theme Address" by R.I. President-Elect Jonathan B. Majiyagbe. Yes, our new theme for Rotary Year 2003-04 is "LEND A HAND". Having heard of this message of our new theme "Lend A Hand",

I felt immediately that such a common phrase with which we had been heard with similar meaning, I did not think it was difficult to handle the task with our community today as we had been helping people around us all the time. But with the emphases of the wording "Lend A Hand" by our R.I. President-Elect, we should have accomplished it even better.

All Governors-Elect had to attend a 6 consecutive days training. We started at 8.30a. m. everyday and finished by 6.30p.m. with two Plenary Sessions and three to four Discussion Groups. The Sergeant-At-Arms checked the roll for all the classes to see if there were any absentees. The classes were formed by 15 to 20 Governors-Elect with several different nationalities, and each Discussion Group swapped around with different classmates. We could meet more new friends and achieve more different ideas with this group rotating system. After the daily classes, we had to attend the evening functions such as the International Fellowship Dinner, International Festival Talent Night and Farewell Dinner. Although it was an intensive and tight-scheduled training, I found the entire program educational and most of all an enjoyable

To give clubs and districts directions for service in the coming year, President-Elect Jonathan has identified family, literacy, poverty and health as emphases for service in 2003-04, and he has appointed a task force for each. The task forces are the Family of Rotary, Literacy and Education, Poverty Alleviation, and Health Concerns. I will give more information to the district when the time comes.

Email Guidelines for Rotarians

扶輪社員的電郵守則

- 1. Email pertaining to Rotary should contain "Rotary" in the subject line.
- All Rotary Email should contain a signature block that includes the name of the person sending the Email and the sender's title or committee designation (if any).
- 3. No Rotarian should be added to an "e-groups" or other type of bulk mailing list without that person's permission; excepting mailing lists specifically established for RI Directors, Trustees, and Officers (including, but not limited to District Governors, District Governors Elect, District Governors Nominee), as well as RI Committee members, RI Task Force Chairmen and Coordinators, DICOs, CICOs, and Club President.
- By virtue of having accepted the duties and responsibilities of their

- positions, Rotarians included in the "exception" list in Guideline #3 shall be presumed to have given permission to receive Email pertaining to their positions.
- There should be no presumption of delivery of Email, unless the Email is acknowledged by the recipient.
- 6. E-groups and other bulk mailing lists shall not be used for expressing political views or for the distribution of "spam," such as jokes and the like.
- All policies and procedures contained in the Rotary International Manual of Procedure pertaining to circularization shall be applicable to all Email communication.
- E-mail lists shall not be published in any form that is available to the public.
 Websites containing mailing lists or individual e-mail addresses (other than

- the e-mail addresses of the webmasters) should be password protected. Such passwords should not be distributed to non-Rotarians.
- All users of e-mail should be encouraged to maintain an up-todate version of virus-checking software on their computers.
- 10. Whenever possible, attachments to e-mails should be avoided. Copy and paste information into the body of the email. If an attachment is absolutely necessary, the attachment should be scanned to ensure that it is virus free before it is sent.
- Brevity in email messages is encouraged. No Forwarding of email without consent. Copying large numbers of Rotarians is discouraged.
