Selected Club Projects from Our District

RC of Tsuen Wan 荃灣社 **The Grand Completion of 'School of Hope' Campus**「希望小學」校園竣工

The 30th of November 2002 was surely a memorable day to celebrate the grand completion of the first primary school campus supported by the Rotary Club of Tsuen Wan in PRC.

The 'School of Hope' was the name of this primary school located at a remote small village at Yau Peng, Shantou. Five years ago, our committee decided to bring 'Hope' of education to those children residing in remote village by donating RMB300, 000 to build a three-storey high school extension building. The new school extension containing 18 classrooms not only replaced the dilapidated 'Tsz Tong' that was used as teaching rooms for village boys at that moment but also provided more seats than before.

For all these years, we had kept funding the School in improving the campus like library facilities, toilets facilities, stone rubble fencewall, etc.

This year, we had built a front and back entrance gate and installed a stone plate donated by President Allan engraved with the name of the School signifying the grand completion of the entire School campus.

In celebrating the grand completion, a simple but solemn ceremony was conducted on that day. PPPatrick and PPPi first installed the Rotary emblem in the heart of the sun at the front entrance gate designed by International Director Cleeve Chan meaning the heat of Rotary love kept reaching out. President Allan then pulled off the covering cloth over the stone plate echoed by the loud firecracker sound. Then, VP Dominic, Rotarian Chuk, and Rotarianne Bertha, Kwong Har, Aurora and Annie presented winning awards to students and teachers.

How unfortunate was the student's performance had to be called off because of the rain. May be next year!

The third round of selection of patient self-help projects was conducted on 5 September 2002 at 6:00 pm. The assessment panel comprised:

Being the past and current convenors of the Patient Self-help Projects Scheme, Rtn Flora and Estella were the observers at the meeting.

The 13 proposals received from 13 patient groups were assessed against our agreed criteria, which include the number of persons to be benefited, the project objectives, the expected effectiveness of the proposal in helpingtheparticular patients, etc. At the end of the meeting, the panel reached a consensus to grant funding to 4 projects.

The allocation of funding (Total amount: \$16,000) is as follows:

- 1 \$5,000 (transport and other costs for visits
 and gatherings) for Stroke patients;
- 2 \$5,000 (cost of publication of pamphlets on the disease) for Psoriasis patients;
- 3 \$3,000 for (cost of transport and photography for visits) Retinitis Pigmentosa patients; and
- 4 \$3,000 for Psychiatric rehabilitation patients to organize IT training for members (cost of training materials and transport subsidy).

A cheque presentation cum launching of the self-help projects ceremony was held at the Hospital Authority's Health Info World on 14 November 2002. RCQ members were able to meet the patients and learn first hand about their self-help projects. President Carolyn made a speech and, together with assessment panel members and other RCQ members, congratulated the self-help groups on their achievements.

The theme of World Peace -Christmas Card Design Exhibition for Victoria Park School for the Deaf and Hong Kong School of the Deaf

Early November this year, Community Service Director Jason proposed a Christmas fun project for the children in Victoria Park School for the Deaf, an institution which the Rotary Club of Hong Kong Island East helped to build in 1960. This community project was supported by President Chris Howe, Ms Lun - Principal of Victoria Park School for the Deaf and Ms Lai - Principal of the HK School for the Deaf. The committee further extended the project idea to involve 40 pupils from 2 schools to design their X'mas cards, with a common theme of world peace - "sow the seeds oflowe".

With the assistance of Rotaract Clubs of HK Island East (Pres. Michael) and Lingnan University (Pres. Wai-Man), there were 40 Rotaractors helping each pupil individually to select their designated countries in Africa, Europe, America and Asia. These 80 young people worked as a team (pair basis) to find out the country particulars from the Internet search, especially regarding the name and address of their presidents or prime ministers. When the pupils took the initiative to design their cards and wrote their messages, the Rotaractors helped them to do the English translation, and color-copy their cards for subsequent X'mas card exhibition.

Some presidential secretaries and consulate generals of these countries (Singapore, Sri Lanka, Israel, India and Macao) were kind enough to write back quickly to the pupils with a personal note. It was clearly exciting for the pupils to receive a reply from other places in the world and to look at different stamps, and to imagine what it would look like to live there - a joy probably beyond words to describe.

The highlight of the event was an exhibition of their 40 cards and a fun day at Metroplaza, Kwai Fong on December 15, 2002 from 10 a.m. - 2 p.m. The opening was officiated by DG Gloria Chan of District 3450 and PDG Uncle Peter, PP John Kwok of Hong Kong Island East. The pupil artworks were nicely decorated and exhibited in the Metroplaza. We witnessed the pride from their parents and a lot of admiration from the visitors.

The event was well attended with 200 pupils, teachers, parents, and project helpers. Thanks to PP John Luk to help getting the provision of venue and facility. Rotary Club of Hong Kong Island East was glad to organize this X'mas event for the deaf children and their parents and it had been a long time tradition held by the Club.

RC of Peninsula 半島社 **Public Toilet Project in China**公廁建造計劃

Tourists in mainland China are often sturned by the terriblesituations of the public to ilets there, especially aftermajor public holidays as a result of insufficient cleaning and poor maintenance.

Despite the government's ardent efforts to improve the situation in many major tourist spots, much is left to be desired. In Yunnan Province where the mountainous relief in most areas has especially hindered the modernization of basic living conditions, only 3.2 million out of all 8.5 million households in the province had their own private toilets, which is a mere 37.6%. The primitive design with no flushing facilities lead to high rates of hygiene-related health problems such as diarrhea, parasitismandhepatitis.

The Rotary Club of Peninsula, seeing the need for betterhygienicfacilitiesforpeoplevisitingJianshui, an old county famous for various kinds of water wells from the old times in Yunnan, has co-sponsored the building of a well designed and maintained public toilet with the Salvation Army in Hong Kong and the Yunnan Province Health Education Society. People in the neighbourhood will be glad to see a new public toilet in use before next summer. The project will of course benefit people in the vicinity. Apart from the construction of a public to ilet for use, this project will provide training on the management, maintenance and repair of the toilet to ensure that it can be used properly in the long run. Public health awareness education/ campaigns will also be organized to enhance people's awareness of the importance of health and hygiene.

For holding a higher position in the District, as they have to carry out their duties they need to work very hard and close with their colleagues day by day, and week by week to make the project and program in a perfect condition as expected. These groups of Rotarians should receive our respect and recognition. But for some "nobody" Rotarians, they gave the same amount of time and energy, and even spent the same amount of money with us in order to offer helping hands and showing support of the project, we should pay them even more respect. I agreed with many of our PDGs, if we have many more of these devoted Rotarians, we would have a much stronger District. My dear fellow Rotarians, where are you?

Our project of Hepatitis B Immunization started off with the charity gala premiere of "The Tuxedo". It took place at the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre on the 7th October. There was an opening ceremony by DG Gloria, Chairman

Rtn David Harilela, and of course superstar Jackie Chan. A delegation including Dr. Qi Xiao-Qui, Director Wang Li-Ji and Professor Wang Zhao representing the Ministry of Health of PRC came to support the project. From an unofficial report, this first program was a very successful one with a total fundraised over \$600,000.00. Many thanks to our fellow Rotarians and congratulations to our DistrictGovernor.

The 43rd District Conference was held in the Macau Tower Convention & Entertainment Centre on the 19th and 20th October. R.I. President Bhichai Rattakul has kindly sent his personal representative Past R.I. Director Rafael G. Hechanova together with Rotaryanne Mely to attend our conference. It was three years ago since our last District Conference held in Macau, and this time we have a completely new venue to experience. Our conference chairman PP Peter Chau has worked extraordinarily hard to achieve the success of this event, he should be highly recognized. Please take a break now our dear Peter; I need you for something else very soon.

From the 22nd to 27th October, it was an unusual time for Shirley and me. It is compulsory for all DGEs to take part in the GETS (Governor Elect Training Seminar) in Manila together with 28 DGEs

from another 10 countries in zones 4B, 6B and 7B. We started the seminar on the 23rd and finished by the 24th October. Although there were only two days, we had a very tight schedule running from early morning to late evening each day and our classes were running continuously with very little coffee breaks. The trainers were very good under the leadership of PDG Jackson Hsieh of D3520 Taiwan. We were taught with all the update information about Rotary and discussed all things from very fundamental problems to building visions for the future. But of course, the seminar was only to give a first touch of some information to help us to be a good and welltrained District Governor to serve our Rotary Year 2003/04. There will be a lot more to explore in 2003 International Assembly in Anaheim in January. I amgetting ready for it.

I remained staying in Manila for Regional Rotary Foundation Seminar on the 25th October, and for Rotary Zone Institute Manila 2002 from 25th to 27th October. Having learned and heard a lot of good speakers in different occasions, I think I can pass on and share my experience with my fellow Rotarians in the District any time.

DG Gloria led a delegation of 10 Rotarians to Handan City in Heibei Province from 30th October to 1st November for a kick-off ceremony of our Hepatitis B Project in China. We were well received by the Mayor and many other officials the whole trip. The aim of this trip was to launch this 10-year project and to carry out the actual operation of immunization for the babies in poor areas in the city. This is only the beginning and there will be 9 more years to go, great.

Selected Club Projects from Our District

RC of Tolo Harbour 吐露港社 **The Rotary O'drama** 扶輪體育戲劇節

Rotary Drama Competition was an annual event organized by the Rotary Club of Tolo Harbour for the past twelve years with great success. To commemorate the 15th Anniversary of the Club and to drum up interest before the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, a theme on sports had been chosen. The Rotary O'drama, consisted of a series of drama activities with "sports" as its theme, was being organized with an aim to increase the interest of youth on both drama and sports.

The objective of the Rotary O'drama was to build up sportsmanship and teamwork among youth. In view of the hosting of the 2008 Olympiad in Beijing and the 2005 East-Asian Games in Macau, the Rotary O'drama to be held locally would be the first phase of the project, which would be expanded to cover Macau in 2005 (Phase 2) and major cities within China by 2008 (Phase 3).

The event encouraged participants to perform a 25-minutes drama with anoriginal script, incorporating sports, informor inspirit, orasalegendary to enter into a competition with the preliminary audition in February, the finals in April and May, and a grand performance in August 2003. A series of forums and workshops would jointly organized with the Jockey Club Continuous Life-wide Learning Centre and the Chung Ying Theatre, providing technical support to all participating teams. The forums in the first stage were organized on 8th and 15th December, 2002. In addition, famous Hong Kong dramatists and sportsmen/sportswomen have been appointed as advisors or ambassadors and they would share their experience with participants.

He said he was a sports champion in secondary school and have won gold medal in relay event. Mr Chung said sports was a challenge of distance, time and height, while arts was a challenge of truth, virtue and beauty. Had he not chosen drama, his first choice, he would have chosen sports, which was second on his list.

Over 2,000 join Rotary Walk to raise over HK\$400,000 for a polio-free world

Since Rotary International launched PolioPlus in 1985, the number of polio cases worldwide has dropped by 99%, from 350,000 cases in 1986 to less than 500 cases in 2001. Nearly two billion children received polio vaccine and were protected from the disease. As of February 2002, the poliovirus still circulates intencountries, mainly the world's less developed countries and regions such as India and Africa.

In support of the one-year Polio Eradication Fundraising Campaign of Rotary International to defeat polio by 2005, Rotary Club of Bayview Sunshine Hong Kong, Ling Liang Church Kindergarten and its Alumni Association jointly organized a fund-raising walkathon at the Peak on November 10, 2002.

The walkathon attracted over 2,000

participants, consisting of 600 kindergarten students, parents and Rotarians, and successfully raised over HK\$430,000 for PolioPlus, a humanitarian program launched by Rotary International to protect children worldwide from the fatal consequences of polio.

Mrs Gloria Chan, District Governor of District 3450 of Rotary International, said at the officiating ceremony, "We are very glad that

our event today fully demonstrates Rotary's 2002-03 theme 'Sow the Seeds of Love'. Every dollar raised is a gift of love to children who need vaccine. Every act we perform is sowing a seed of love in the heart of every participant. We hope love is infused into our future action to help build a beautiful and healthy world."


Be the Best Project or the Best Rotarian to promote The 4-Way Test in our District
