District Governor Message

Eugene Fong District Governor 2013-2014



Paul Harris was a man that lived through the chaos and ravages of two world wars, and thus bore witness to the havoc wrought by jingoism, partisanism, and general disintegration. Thus, the orientation of the Rotary mission that he laid down was likely in opposition to the disintegrated and destructive zeitgeist of the wartorn times in which he lived. This opposition and direction can both clearly be seen when he put forth Rotary as, "...an integrating force in a world where forces of disintegration are all too prevalent".

While unfortunate, in that he lived to see the ravages and disintegration of two world wars, he was nevertheless fortunate enough see the actualization of his vision and the fruition of his aspirations in integrating a post-war torn world. One of the most salient examples of Rotary's contribution to integrating a fractured and divided world is the long history Rotary shares with the United Nations. Beginning in 1945, 49 Rotarians went to San Francisco to help draft the UN Charter, and since that time Rotary and the UN have been close partners. Even Polio Plus is a product born of the relationship between ourselves and UN agencies.

However, what has become of the legacy of Paul Harris? Have we found ourselves resting on our laurels? Has our cursus honorum, like that of the late Roman Republic, been marred by hints of decadence? We must ask ourselves, are our efforts being fueled by civic virtue and directed toward maximizing the good we can do in the world, or are club and personal gain becoming increasingly important factors in how we conduct Rotary business.

Our motto is the same, word for word, as it was when it was first penned: "Service Above Self". Are we still upholding this motto, or has it simply become a slogan to grace our banners and merchandise, and be chanted incessantly, but practiced rarely. Putting service above self also means putting the good we can do above interpersonal squabbles and petty administrative divisions. There is a second half to the quote cited above regarding Rotary's role as an integrative force. Paul Harris wanted, "Rotary [to be] a microcosm of a world at peace, a model which nations will do well to follow." Rotary did well to pull the world up from the factious wartime period and help promote integration. However, after over half a century,

I must ask you all: Do we look like a microcosm of a world at peace?

Rotary Statement re: Syria Outbreak

Polio was recently confirmed in Syria, a country that has been free of this disabling and potentially fatal disease since 1999. In response, health authorities in Syria and neighboring countries have launched urgent, large-scale, multi-country immunization campaigns to ensure that every child is reached with the polio vaccine.

Rotary and its partners in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative are working together with local health authorities to activate the outbreak response.

In the wake of World Polio Day, these and other recent polio cases in previously polio-free countries serve as a stark reminder that as long as polio still exists, unimmunized children everywhere remain at risk.

Rotarians, as leaders from all continents, cultures and occupations, have been active throughout the region to raise awareness and build support in the fight to end polio: FGYPT

In coordination with the Egyptian Ministry of Health, Rotary clubs in Egypt will support and help raise awareness of the national immunization activities in November.

JORDAN

In September, district and national Rotary PolioPlus committees in Jordan visited the Minister of Health to offer support for the nationwide measles, rubella and polio vaccination campaign scheduled this week.

Rotarians secured funds for updated equipment needed to vaccinate more children, and are raising public awareness to encourage families to immunize their children by posting large 'End Polio Now' signs in Arabic on major streets in Amman.

LEBANON

Rotary Clubs have joined with the Lebanese Ministry of Health, WHO and UNICEF to help vaccinate children, particularly those from displaced families below the age of five. Rotarians will help raise awareness in their communities and provide volunteer support during national immunization campaigns scheduled for early November and December.

TURKEY

Rotarians are establishing a coordinating committee in Turkey and approaching the Ministry of Health to offer their support.

BULGARIA

Rotarians in Bulgaria are working with the Red Cross to lead a campaign to collect food, baby food and diapers for Syrian refugees. On World Polio Day, Rotarians and Rotaractors handed out 'End Polio Now' flyers printed in the local language to help raise awareness.

We know that if polio remains endemic, outbreaks will continue to occur, and that's why the progress being made in the three remaining polio-endemic countries (Afghanistan, Pakistan and Nigeria) is encouraging. Polio cases in the endemic countries are down by 40% compared to the same time last year.

We, as Rotarians, remain steadfast in our commitment to a polio-free world, and we will continue our efforts until polio is gone forever.

With fresh Rotarians in the loop, experienced Rotarians poised to attack District goals, and old guard Rotarians equipped with the skills to design and apply for Rotary Foundation grants, let's bring in the New Year by doing some good to the world!

Updates on Rotary business such as Public Image, Rotary Foundation and Finances were presented at the Institute. There were also workshops which enable the audience to interact with the matters concerned.

The most impressive session for me was the sharing of "Why Rotary?" by Past Rotary International Bhichai Rattakul. He shared an enlightening story of a Rotary President, who could only make enough money to maintain his family, enjoyed contributing to Rotary via hands-on service. In a tragic event, he sacrificed his life in a polio immunization mission to save his family from deadly river current. PRIP Bhichai urges Rotary to stop to become a gigantic bureaucratic organisation, be "Back to Basics" and focused on services. As a young Rotarian, we may have limited financial resources. However, it does not mean that we cannot live Rotary's motto "Service Above Self". I truly hope to share this message with fellow Rotarians in my club and the District to be "back to basics" and enjoy the fruitfulness of service.

On 16-Nov-2013, PDG Jones, PDG Kenneth accompanied Rotary Club of Kowloon Northeast and also the club's RCC members in their visit to Hong Chi Pinehill Pre-school Centre.

About Hong Chi Pinehill Pre-school Center (匡智松嶺學前兒童中心)

It is the first of its kind in Hong Kong providing year-round residential care and education for children up to six years of age. Most of the children are orphans, and some are from families which cannot take care of them due to special circumstances. The Center also offers early education and training for infants and children with developmental disorders.

他不幸生於破壞與瓦解的兩次世界大戰中,但幸運地,他可以看到他的願景和抱負在戰後得以 實現。其中一個顯著的例子是扶輪和聯合國長時間一起為瀰合斷裂和分離的世界進行不懈的努力。1945年,49位扶輪社員前住三藩市協助草擬聯合國憲章,自此,扶輪和聯合國結成緊密的伙 伴關係。

然而,保羅哈里斯遺留的財富將何去何從?我們能夠在已取得的成績中尋找自我?我們的榮耀會否如古羅馬共和般與衰落同行?我們一定要捫心自問,我們的努力是否由公民美德所驅動,為服務世界做到最好,扶輪社或社員在推動扶輪事業中獲益良多。

我們的座右銘仍一如往昔沒有改變:服務至尚。我們是否仍擁抱這個座右銘,或只是把他純粹當成旗幟上的一個口號,只說不做。服務至尚也可應用於人與人之間和瑣碎的行政事務之中;服務至尚也引証了扶輪是世界上不可分割的力量。保羅哈里斯希望:扶輪是世界和平的縮影,各國仿效的榜樣。扶輪在推動世界由戰爭時期的分裂轉趨融合做出了貢獻。但是,經歷了過半世紀,我們再一次問問自己:我們真的做到世界和平的縮影了嗎?
