In fact, Chairman Kenneth began organizing this conference since May 2001. ### Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA)

The RYLA Organizing Committee, which was headed by Chairman PP Dr. Charles Cheng and Youth Generation Co-ordinator PDG Joseph Lee as well as Advisors PP Herbert Lau, DGN Jones Wong, PP Louis Thomas and Host Club President Ramesh Chugani, met on a regular basis to give shape to a perfectly organized RYLA 2001-2002 Camp.

The RYLA 2001-2002 theme, which was chosen to go along with The RI theme of "Mankind is our Business", was "Youth is our Business" and the threestage programme was well planned.

The First Stage - a fundamental Leadership Orientation Seminar entitled "Leadership in the 21st Century" - was held at the Tower Club on 15th December 2001 (Saturday) to introduce the aims and targets of the RYLA programme. Our guest speaker was Dr. Howard Cheng from the Department of Social Sciences, Hong Kong Polytechnic University, whose presentation was entitled "How Young People Can Nurture Leadership Potential in the New Century"

The Second Stage of the programme was a 3-day, 2-night camp held from 22nd - 24th February 2002 at Adventure Corp. The 3-day programme had been very well planned, with action training and interaction between groups and individuals,

On Day 1, the 39 male and 68 female trainees, together with the 14 volunteers, were picked up by three buses which took us to High Island Training Camp in Sai Kung in time for our scheduled start of 10.30 am. After the welcoming address and RYLA flag hoisting ceremony (which was held every morning), 4 teams were formed, dormitories were allocated and everyone participated in ice-breaking games.







The Training exercises began in earnest after lunch with Training Circuit A (Parts I & II). Since the group was large, it was divided into 2 sections alternating between The Elementary Map Reading/ Orienteering Exercise and the Radio Voice Procedures and exercise. There was no doubt that trainers and volunteers alike enjoyed taking part in these exercises.

After an early dinner, there was a night walk followed by a debriefing and review of the day's activities. The first day at Camp had been so full of activities that everyone was quite tired, but happy.

Day 2 began early with a 6.00am Reveille rousing us for the RYLA flag hoisting ceremony and a sightseeing trip to East Sea Coffer Dam, High Island Reservoir, where a "Stretcher" Race was held before heading back to Camp for breakfast and the start of Training Circuit B (Part 1) at 9.00am.

Teams rotated around 4 "stands" - Rock Climbing/ Abseiling; Command Tasks; Drill Practice; and an Introduction to the Obstacle Course - each of which lasted 1 hour.

After lunch, Training Circuit B (Part 11) continued, followed by preparation for the field training and departure at 5.00pm for the field training area where team bases were set up and dinner prepared. That evening they camped outside and since they had to be up early the following morning, probably only slept for about 2 hours.

Day 3 - the teams were collected at 7.00am and were debriefed on the field training prior to breakfast, after skills and getting along with other team members. We were joined during the day, by Rotary District officials who watched the competitions and were very interested to see that the Campsite was the ideal location for such training. The camp ended with

During the camp, Rylarians had been asked to choose one leader per team and at the end of the day, each team submitted their leader's name. We had a short discussion with the team leaders as to what would be their next project in order to qualify to win the best Rylarian award and attend the R.I. Convention in Barcelona in June.

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# "Smart Living" Youth Forum cum Anti-drugs Video Competition 「活得有型」青年論壇暨禁毒宣傳短片比賽

The "Smart Living" Youth Forum cum Anti-drugs Video Competition, Prize Presentation Ceremony was successfully held on Saturday, 2 February 2002 at the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre. We were honored to have Mrs. Carrie Lam, JP, Director of Social Welfare, HKSAR to be the Guest of Honour and give a speech regarding the drug abuse situation in Hong Kong. There was an audience of about 400 people, including students, Rotarians, Rotaractors and the press.

These two events were organized by our District 3450 and the Hong Kong Youth Institute, and co-organized by the Action Committee Against Narcotics, the Department of Social Work, The Chinese University of Hong Kong and the Barnabas Charitable Service Association. The Organizing Committee of these two events, headed by the Co-chairman Mr. Monty Loh and PP Parry Poon, with Youth Generation Co-ordinator PDG Joseph Lee, PP Robert Kong, PP Alice Liu, PP Didi Yip and Mr. Walter Lee met on a regular basis to work out the proceedings.

The Forum started at 9:00 in the morning was divided into two sessions: "Conversation Session" and "Discussion Session". In the Conversation Session, four ex-drug users from Barnabas Charitable Service Association were invited to share their experience. They gave the message in a song and a short drama, touching the hearts of the young audience.

In the Discussion Session, Prof. Daniel Shek of the

Department of Social Work, CUHK, was invited as the moderator. The panelist included Prof. Lee Shiu-hung, SBS, JP, Chairman of Action Committee Against Narcotics; Mr. Chan Shun-chi, Peter, Outstanding Young Person of Hong Kong, 1987; Mr. Shiu Yau-hung, Chinese YMCA of Hong Kong Shau Kei Wan / Chai Wan Outreaching Social Work Team Leader; and Mr. Wong Wing-fai, Samuel, Outstanding Anti-drug Worker (Gold Award). The topic for discussion was the psychological aspect

of drug abuse among youths. Some of the points they raised were as follows:

- The major reason for using drugs was peer-group pressure. The most dangerous age for using drugs was during their secondary school days. Most of the people would not use drugs after their teens.
- 2. For preventive measures, education and concern of parents were the two best ways to reduce drug abuse.
- Not only the Government and the anti-drug organizations, but also the love and care of their families was most effective in helping the young abusers quit the habit for good.
- Partnership between the Government and Nongovernmental Organizations is important to facilitate total commitment of society in beating drugs.

Another activity in this project was the Anti-drugs Video Competition. The aim of this competition was to encourage the creativity of youths and to present the anti-drugs concept in an attractive way. The activity started to call for

applications in October last year. By the deadline of 10 November, 2001, we received about 90 applications. After assessing their scripts on 5 December, 2001, 23 teams were selected to produce their videos.

The panel of 7 judges including Ms. Connie Lam, Director of Communication and Development; the Art Centre, Dr. Tam Wing Kun, Chairman of the Sub-committee of Drug Abuse, the Action Committee Against Narcotics; Mr. Charles Wang, Executive Director, the Salem Film (Hong Kong) Co. Limited; Mr. Ko Tin Lung, Art Director, the Chung Ying Theatre Company; Mr. Lam Chiu Wing, Columnist and Artist; Mr. Lai Man Cheuk, PR Director, ATV; and PP Jackie Tam, selected 5 finalists in the judge meeting held on 23 January

2002. The 5 finalist videos were shown in the Youth Forum and the audience voted for the winners. The results are as follows:
