區總監的話

各位社友：

2001年吉隆坡扶輪研習會將於10月19至21日在馬來西亞吉隆坡舉行，洪宏道前區總監負責在港的報名事宜，經我在前兩期總監月報及各社公式訪問中作出宣傳後，已經有大約三十位社友報名，參加這個所有扶輪社員均可參與的重要研習會。

國際扶輪把10月定為職業服務月，強調所有扶輪社及社員在日常生活及工作中均要遵循職業服務的理想；並建議各社進行以下的活動：

1. 表揚一位參與地區活動的扶輪義工。
2. 推廣參與扶輪康樂及職業聯誼活動。
3. 贊助一項職業服務活動。
4. 在欠缺社員的職業分類中推動社員擴展活動。

各扶輪社也可對青少年提供職業指導，包括為大學同學安排就業指引活動及作模擬面試活動等，以便畢業生可以應付實際的面試；也可在例會中安排或鼓勵社會上的其他團體作其他國家的文化、經濟及地理環境的演講，以協助克服由於外籍勞工大量遷移而帶來的語言隔膜、文化差異及不同社會背景所產生的種種困難。



我也鼓勵各扶輪社與當地的商會建立連繫，發展服務機會；如能一起合辦諸如僱員培訓、退休後服務機會、功能識字計劃、濫用藥物防治計劃、以至職業嘉許計劃等活動，則獲益更大。

扶輪義工計劃的成立是為了引起大家作出對扶輪或其他機構所贊助有意義的服務計劃中，所衍生的志願服務機會；為各扶輪社與地區尋找那些當地無法找到的專業技術義務人員，扶輪社員、其配偶、扶輪學人、以至非扶輪社員均可參與該計劃。

為了回應本月主題，一個由資深職業服務前輩區錦源前區總監主持的地區職業服務研討會，將於2001年10月30日（星期二）中午十二時三十分假半島扶輪社的午餐例會上舉行，歡迎所有扶輪社員出席。

由九龍東北扶輪社主辦的地區游泳比賽已於上（9）月23日（星期日）舉行，當日出席的社友及嘉賓約有300人，大埔扶輪社囊括了男、女子及全場總冠軍等三個大獎，我謹致衷心祝賀。國際獅子會第303區由吳國勝總監率領，應邀參加4x25公尺接力賽；其老少一行30人的龐大代表團，既體現其對扶輪友會的支持，也顯示了對其總監的擁護，值得我們效法，畢竟「服務人類是我們的事業」。

Ever since *Rotary World* was first published in February 1995 as a newspaper for Rotary leaders, clubs have been receiving three gratis copies. With this issue, clubs will now receive only one. Rapidly rising postal rates have forced this change.

Fortunately, more and more Rotarians have access to *Rotary World* through the Internet (www.rotary.org/newsandinfo/RotaryWorld/index.html). The nine-language versions of the five-times-a-year newspaper are posted at that RI Web site, together with a number of back issues. They can be easily downloaded, copied, and circulated. An added feature of the Web version of the newspaper is its color photographs, the cost of which is prohibitive for the printed paper.

Of course, many Rotarians lack computer access and/or prefer a printed copy of the newspaper. It is my hope that club presidents will continue to share their copies of *Rotary World* with the club bulletin editor, the membership as a whole, and Rotaract and Interact clubs that the club sponsors.

I ask club presidents and governors to please make known to their fellow Rotarians, through club bulletins and the governor's monthly letter, that *Rotary World* is available both on the Web, at the address above, and by US\$5 individual subscription. ***Last Chance* for Nominations for District Governor 2003-2004**

2003-2004 年度區總監提名最後機會

Nominations are now open for District Governor for 2003-2004. The procedures for the election of the District Governor Nominee are outlined in the Manual of Procedure. Briefly, at the time of selection, the candidate must be a member in good standing in a functioning club in good standing with no outstanding indebtedness to RI or the district and has serviced as president for a full term. The candidate must have been a member for at least seven years by the time he assumes office and must also demonstrate willingness, commitment and ability to fulfill the duties and responsibilities of the office of governor.

In practice, the candidate would be endorsed by his club, and the club would forward the nomination to the District Governor, together with a statement by the candidate and a statement of his qualifications by the club. All nominations must reach the District Governor by 5pm on Wednesday 14 November 2001.

Club Presidents who are interested to nominate a candidate from his club can obtain the necessary documentations from District Governor in person.

The Balloting Committee for Membership of the Nominating Committee for District Governor 2003-2004 (DGN), convened and chaired by District Governor-elect Gloria Chan, met on 13th October 2001 and returned the following members and alternates for the respective areas -

In accordance with Procedures adopted for the District for nominating DGN, These nine members elected or their respective Alternates, will attend the DGN Nominating Committee to be held on 6th December 2001, and together with nine Past Governors present, nominate the best qualified Rotarian who is available to serve as District Governor for the year 2003-2004.

確實做法是：該候選人須獲得其所屬扶輪社同意，由所屬扶輪社把提名書、該候選人的聲明及該社就其資格所作的聲明，於2001年11月14日（星期三）下午五時正之前遞交地區總監。

有意提名其社員的社長可親自逕向地區總監索取所需表格及文件。

My dear Rotarians
and Friends,

The 2001 Kuala Lumpur Rotary Institute will be held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia on 19-21 October 2001. Past District Governor Anthony Hung is responsible for registration in Hong Kong. I have promoted this important Institute during my official club visits as well as in my previous Governor's Monthly Letters. Approximately thirty Rotarians have registered or planned to participate in the Institute, which is now open to every Rotarian.

October is designated by the RI Board as Vocational Service Month, in which involvement of clubs and individual Rotarians in the everyday practice of the ideals of Vocational Service is emphasized. Specific activities recommended to clubs are:

1. The recognition of a Rotary Volunteer at a district-level event.
2. Promotion of involvement in Rotary Recreational and Vocational Fellowships.
3. Sponsorship of a Vocational Service activity or project, and
4. Promotion of membership development in open classifications.

Rotary Clubs may offer vocational guidance to young people by arranging an activity in selection of careers, and mock interviews for university students so that the graduated

students have expertise when called for real interviews. Clubs may also arrange at their own meetings, and encourage other groups in their communities, to present programs on cultural, economic and geographical conditions in other countries. The purpose of such programs is to help overcome possible difficulties arising from language barriers and differences in cultural and social backgrounds as a result of mass movement of workers from one country to another.

Rotary Clubs are encouraged to establish communications with local chambers of commerce and industry to look for service opportunities. If possible, it could be more beneficial to have joint service projects, such as employee training, post-retirement service opportunities, functional literacy programs, drug abuse prevention and treatment programs, and vocational recognition programs.

The Rotary Volunteers program was established to create awareness of the volunteer opportunities of Rotary-sponsored service projects and meaningful projects of other organizations. Through this program,

clubs and districts are able to find those volunteers with the required skills, but unavailable locally. Rotarians, spouses, Rotaractors, Foundation Alumni and non-Rotarians may participate in the program.

To observe this special month, a Vocational Service Seminar will be held at the regular lunch meeting of the Rotary Club of Peninsula at 12:30pm, Tuesday, 30 October 2001. All Rotarians are invited and welcome to participate in this Seminar, which will be chaired by Past District Governor Arthur Au, who is an expert in Vocational Service.

A District Swimming Gala was held on Sunday, 23 September 2001, from 11:00am to 6pm. The activity, hosted by the Rotary Club of Kowloon Northeast and Tai Po, was well organized and attended by about three hundred Rotarians and family members. Rotary Club of Tai Po was the overall champion. Both Men's Individual Champion and Ladies' Individual Champion were also from the Rotary Club of Tai Po. Congratulats to all winners!

invited to participate in a 4 x 25 meters relay event. Almost thirty members, including their children, came with District Governor Joseph Ng. The Loins not merely support Rotarians, they are also supportive to their Governor. I wish we could reciprocate the same support when invited to participate in their function to truly show MANKIND IS OUR BUSINESS.

On behalf of District 3450, I attended the Opening Ceremony of the 36th National Convention of Hong Kong Junior Chamber on 21 September 2001 at the Drama Theatre of the Hong Kong Academy of Performing Arts. The Ceremony lasted for two hours and attended by over 400 people. The kick-off ceremony was officiated by Elsie Leung Oi Sie, J.P. Secretary for Justice, Executive Vice-President Area B Lew Wen Teik, National President Michelle Tang and National Immediate Past President Spencer Li. The climax of the opening ceremony

was the Chinese rap talk drama performed by a group of young and intelligent girls to introduce the objectives, the history, the activities and the achievements of each chapter of HKJC.

About mid-September, our district received an appeal from the Rotary Club of Tokyo Hachioji East, D-2750 for a sponsorship of USD 4,000 in support of a matching grant to provide an ultrasound scanner to a maternity and child hospital in Mongolia. I circulated the message to the presidents 2001 at 6:30pm that evening. In less than fifteen hours, I received a positive response from the Rotary Club of Kowloon North, confirming their sponsorship to this project. I am grateful to President Ramesh Chugani for his quick response. With his



leadership, his club members have demonstrated MANKIND IS OUR BUSINESS. Congratulations to each of them.

I would like to remind my Regal presidents and secretaries on election of club officers for Rotary Year 2002-2003 should take place before 31 December 2001. Thirty days advance notice in writing should be given to club members. Required quorum is one-third of total membership (honorary members excluded).

As a result of the efforts of Rotary International, its Foundation and those of our partners, nearly two billion children have received oral polio vaccine and are successfully protected from poliomyelitis.

Progress 1988-2000



Since Rotary began its PolioPlus Program, the number of polio endemic countries has declined from over 125 countries in 1985 to approximately 20 countries in 2001.

Rotary has committed US\$ 402 million for global polio eradication.



Poliovirus Surveillance: Paving the way to Polio Eradication

Virus surveillance is the systematic testing of all identified clinical cases of acute flaccid paralysis (AFP), whether or not poliomyelitis is suspected.

What is the role of AFP surveillance?

- ♦ **To identify high risk areas or groups.** It detects areas where poliovirus transmission is or is likely to occur.
- ♦ **To monitor progress.** AFP surveillance helps determine whether strategies are being implemented effectively.
- ♦ **To certify a country polio-free.** This requires that there are no reports of new cases of polio, and there is evidence that a country can detect a case of polio should it occur.



What is the role of the laboratory in AFP Surveillance?

- ♦ **To confirm** polio by virus isolation.
- ♦ **To trace** the origin of a case.
- ♦ **To certify** that polio has been eradicated.

- ♦ Specimen Containers
- ♦ Refrigerators and Freezers
- ♦ Ice Packs
- ♦ Computers
- ♦ Printers
- ♦ Satellite Phones
- ♦ High Frequency Radios
- ♦ Office Supplies
