### 區總監的話

各位社友：

八月是社員擴展月，所有扶輪社員都應全力以赴去介紹新社員入社。本地區就在八月四日下午，由資深的黃智偉前區總監領導，蔣春蘭前社長主持，舉行了社員擴展研討會，有來自本地區47個社的176位資深社員參加，當中包括在七月二十日地區交職禮上入社不過15日的數位新社員，只有澳門一個社及唯一的蒙古社沒有派員出席（本地區在八月一日專為蒙古的烏蘭巴托社召開了類似的研討會），我謹向黃智偉前區總監、蔣春蘭前社長及各位籌委成員再次致謝。為達到社員擴展的目的，席上我宣佈了以下三項獎勵：

1. 在二〇〇一年七月一日至二〇〇二年五月三十一日期間，介紹最多人入社的一位社員，可獲港幣一千元禮券獎勵；

2. 在二〇〇一年七月一日至二〇〇二年五月三十一日期間，最多社員淨增長的兩位社長（包括50人以下扶輪社及50人以上扶輪社兩組），各獲一張來回台北的經濟客位機票獎勵。

3. 在二〇〇一年七月一日至二〇〇二年五月三十一日期間，其負責的扶輪社社員淨增長總數最多的一位社員擴展委員會委員，可獲兩位三日兩夜獅子星號郵輪套票獎勵。

一九九七年六月，在國際扶輪布朗前社長英明領導下，扶輪社員總人數約為一百二十一萬五千人；到二〇〇〇年六月，總人數跌至一百一十八萬，在不到三年間，少了三萬五千名社員，這是自從第二次世界大戰以來，扶輪社員總人數第一次連續大跌三個扶輪年度。

在剛卸任的2000-01年度國際扶輪戴扶連前

社長及世界社籍主委加里·朗努力下，國際扶輪引入廿一世紀挑戰，令新社員人數大增。國際扶輪理事會定下到2005年，社員人數要達到一百五十萬。為了達成目標，我們要為「扶輪的全球搜尋計劃」努力，在2001-02年度，每一個扶輪社每月至少引薦一位新社員，達到每社至少淨增長五位社員；此外，每一地區更要求至少成立三個新社，或起碼有五個社淨增長社員十五位以上的。

為了應付對扶輪服務迅速增長的需求，我們必須加緊行動，維持強大的社員力量，因為「服務人類是我們的專業」。

我已開始了我的公式訪問，七月三十日公式訪問蒙古烏蘭巴托社的代表團成員包括：陳嘉齡副總監、梁文基副總監、王仲熹區秘書、陳麥樞斌候任區總監、劉敬恆創社社長及標·賓達前社長；我衷心感謝他們每一位的鼎力支持。

當我在蒙古烏蘭巴托社公式發言之後，甘博

社長答應會積極支持本地區，特別在社員擴展方面，原則上已預備輔導一個說蒙古語的扶輪社，實在令人鼓舞！我並且非常榮幸可以代表澳洲坎培拉旭日扶輪社頒發保羅哈里斯之友予姬貝·杜朗（蒙古暱稱「滴滴」）女士。

由3480地區三位牙醫及三位護士組成的扶輪牙科義工，為烏蘭巴托的兒童提供三天的洗牙、補牙及脫牙義工服務，全部經費7,660美元由3480地區台北扶輪社及3450地區大埔扶輪社及半島扶輪社贊助。由總社派出的黃文廣先生負責採訪報導國際扶輪副社長訪問上海臨時社、北京臨時社及烏蘭巴托的扶輪牙科義工服務。

國際扶輪黃其光副社長及一位總社職員一同加入了出席本區代表團，這是首位華籍國際扶輪副社長訪問3450地區。七月三十一日，我設宴款待黃其光副社長，陪同的包括烏蘭巴托扶輪社社員、來自3480台北地區的三位牙醫及三位護士、來自2750日本地區的2000-2001年度扶輪基金獎助金委員會副主席、來自新加坡的前社長伉儷以及香港代表團約30位嘉賓，一時間中文歌、蒙古歌、日本歌交織，氣氛歡樂，場面熱鬧。

國際扶輪黃其光副社長更邀本港代表團順道探訪北京臨時社，從該社戴岩社長、十數位社友、以至黃其光副社長口中，加深了我對該社認識；黃其光副社長更指出該社領袖可任意選擇地方受訓，不過最近的地方是香港，暗示當臨時社正式授證時，理應納入3450地區之內。

## Memories from the Governor Elect.....

### 候任區總監紀行



The end of July marked the lingering joyous and exciting mood from various Clubs having had their own change-overs of Club officers...so the Rotary movement gets carried on, from year to year, with new energy and ideas to serve Mankind.

The District Governor's official visits to the Clubs began in the middle of the month. As an integral part of his delegation, I tried to capture as many visits as possible. These are opportunities for me to learn about each Club's sub-culture and to get to know the Rotarians in the Club.

On route to visit the Rotary Club of Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia, we stopped by Beijing for two days. Meeting up with our Rotary International Vice-President Gary Huang, we all had a pleasant evening with members of the Provisional Club in Beijing. They have already been serving the community in a number of projects. The more notable one was to take charge of flying babies with heart defects to the US for the most advanced and complicated surgeries. The evening ended with better acquaintance among members from Hong Kong, Taipei, and their members from Germany, Denmark, UK and Italy. An experienced and renowned journalist, Wen Huang from RI came along with RI VP Gary for media purposes.

It was a grand occasion at the Rotary Club of Ulaanbaatar for our DG's visit. Not only it was well attended by their own members and potential members, but also Clubs from all over that made Matching Grants in projects with Ulaanbaatar--from Japan, from Singapore etc. The evening was well-balanced by speeches and some very fine musicians playing traditional Mongolian instruments accompanied by skilful singing and dances. The team of dentists (past presidents from RC of Taipei) and some nurses were warmly welcomed. They planned to serve over 100 patients during their five days' service there. Eventually it ended up with nearly 200 patients. That was a great experience to witness Service Above Self.

Most of the delegation from Hong Kong left with DG Johnson after the Board Meeting with RC of Ulaanbaatar. Then came the unexpected invitation to visit the Ulaanbaatar Mayor's office. The service done by District 3450 was recognized. I discussed the special and more urgent needs in the city with the Vice Mayor. Apparently school premises were a more urgently needed area, followed closely by the lack of skills for school leavers to face employment needs.

That afternoon, another unexpected invitation

came from the Office of the President of Mongolia. The RI Vice-President Gary and I were received by the First Lady of Mongolia, along with the President's Advisor and the President's son. The setting up of computers in 30 schools project, funded by RC of Kowloon North, with a Matching Grant from a Club from Malaysia, and the Dental Care community work were highly praised by the First Lady, A. Oyunbileg, who founded the "For Human Good" Foundation that implement projects to help children's health, youth's job opportunities and education. She understood our Rotary service, as she practically "spook" our language of service.

It was definitely a worthwhile visit in that the bonding between Mongolia and Hong Kong was further strengthened. In those few days' time, through interacting with the Ulaanbaatar Rotarians and visiting patients in government housing estates, I got a much better picture of how they live, where the difficulties are and the strength and influence on their communities of the RC of Ulaanbaatar.

Dear fellow Rotarians & friends,

August is Membership & Extension Month. Every Rotarian should try his or her utmost effort to introduce new members into Rotary. In our district, a Membership Development Seminar was arranged in the afternoon of 4 August. The seminar attracted 176 rotarians from 47 clubs. One club in Macau and the only club in Mongolia were not represented. However, we had arranged a similar seminar for the members of the Rotary Club of Ulaanbaatar on the 1 August. Strictly speaking, only one club in Macau did not register for the seminar, which was attended by very senior Rotarians as well as new Rotarians inducted 15 days ago at the District Installation on 20 July. Under the capable leadership of IPP Meggy Tseung and supervised by the experienced PDG Raymond Wong, a remarkable seminar was organized. May I once again extend my gratitude to PDG Raymond, IPP Meggy and her dedicated committee members.

For the purpose of achieving membership growth, I announced the following three awards at the seminar:

1. One award for the Rotarian introducing the highest number of Rotarians into Rotary between 1 July 2001 and 31 May 2002. The award is HKD1,000 gift certificate.

2. One award to each of the 2 presidents of the clubs with highest net membership growth between 1 July 2001 and 31 May 2002. Clubs are divided into two categories, one with less than 50 members, and one with 50 or more members. Each award is one economy class return air ticket to Taipei.

3. One award for the committee member whose responsible clubs have the highest total net membership growth between 1 July 2001 and 31 May 2002. The award is a 3 days and 2 nights cruise on Superstar Leo for 2 passengers.

In June 1997, Rotary's total membership was about 1,215,000. We reached that figure because of the visionary leadership of Past R.I. President Herbert Brown. But in less than three years, it had declined by 35,000 to 1,180,000 by June 2000. It was the first time membership suffered from a tremendous decline for three consecutive Rotary years since World War II.

Under the capable leadership of Immediate Past R.I. President Frank Devlyn and World Membership Chairman Gary Romp, Rotary International introduced the 21st Century Challenge in 2000-01, which has

resulted in many new members. In order to meet the target of 1.5 million members by the year 2005 set by the R.I. Board of Directors, we must work hard on the campaign "Rotary's Global Quest", which is to bring in at least one new member per month per club in the year 2001-02 with a minimum net gain of at least five members per club. In addition to the net gain in membership, each district is asked to form at least three new clubs or to have at least five clubs achieve a net membership increase of at least 15 new members. To meet the rapid demand for Rotary service, we must have a strong membership for Rotary. To achieve this, we must take action because "MANKIND IS OUR BUSINESS".

I have started my official visits to various clubs. My visit to the Rotary Club of Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia was on 30 July. My delegation included DGE Gloria, AG Edmond,

AG Tenny, DS Jones, CP Herbert and IPP Bill. My sincere thanks goes to each of them for their dedicated support.

After my speech at the official visit, President L. Gombo gave a vote of thanks in which he promised to support the district, especially in membership growth. The club agreed in principle to sponsor a Mongolian-speaking Rotary club, the action of which is very encouraging. I was honoured to present a Paul Harris Fellow recognition to a lady named Gabrielle Dowlong (Mongolian pet name, Didi) on behalf of the Rotary Club of Canberra Sunrise in Australia.

A Rotary Dental Volunteer Services, comprising of three dentists and three nurses from District 3480, was providing a three-day volunteer services to the children in Ulaanbaatar for teeth cleaning, fillings and extraction. Their entire expenses of USD7,660 were jointly sponsored by the Rotary Club of Taipei, District 3480 and District 3450, which was represented by Rotary Club of Tai Po and the Rotary Club

was hosted by myself in the honour of VP Gary, with about 30 guests, including members of the Rotary Club of Ulaanbaatar, 3 dentists and 3 nurses from District 3480, Taipei, the 2000-2001 Vice Chairman of the Rotary Foundation Grants Committee of District 2750, Japan, a Past President with his wife from Singapore and the entire Hong Kong delegation. The dinner was full of fun and joy. Chinese songs, Mongolian songs, as well as Japanese songs were sung.

On my way to Ulaanbaatar, I and my

delegation from Hong Kong were invited by R.I. Vice President Gary to visit the Provisional Rotary Club of Beijing, when I could meet their provisional club President Jens Dreier and about ten other members. From the speeches of VP Gary and provisional club President Jens, I had a better understanding about the club. VP Gary told the club leaders that they might go anywhere for their training, but Hong Kong is the closest place, implying that when the provisional club is chartered to become a Rotary Club, it should be included in District 3450.

This seminar was held on 4th August 2001 at the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine, Aberdeen to create awareness as well as to provide opportunity for participants to share the problems and experience of their own club. A total of 179 participants came in that sunny afternoon to meet, to greet and to treat this topic a serious one. The chairman IPP Meggy and the Organizing Committee members were excited with the overwhelming response.

PDG Vincent To, the key note speaker, highlighted all with 10 easy ways to attract and retain Rotary Members and also tips on membership retention.

During the Open Forum, participants were keen on lining up to express their views and experience. Useful best practices were shared:

- organize interest groups
- build a network among Clubs so as to refer potential member if he/she does not fit your club
- consider to adjust cost to accommodate young members
- invite spouse to join
- do not victimize membership by gender
- rejuvenate senior members and past presidents
- capitalize on the resources of Interactors and Rotaracters
- back to basic; promote the value of Rotary actions both internally and externally

DG Johnson reminded all on the growth target: one new member per club per month; 5 members net growth per club per year. He also announced 3 awards to energize the call. One of the awards is for the Rotarian introducing the highest number of Rotarians into Rotary between 1/7/2001 and 31/5/2002. The award is HK\$1,000 gift certificate



PDG Raymond, District Membership Development Co-ordinator Committee Chairman wrapped up the seminar by telling us 2 stories of how Rotary's love and care spread around the needies, helping them to rebuild their dignity, living a brilliant life. This is the value of joining Rotary. This is what we are proud of being a Rotarian. This is the most powerful tool for membership growth.
